All –

In the continuing effort to identify our office priorities (and at the request of the Region), Larry is asking each branch to define our top priority areas of work. Within our branch (which is a very diverse creature), I see we have three general arenas we need to consider:

1. Environmental Contaminants – John and Chris
2. Conservation Planning Assistance – Melissa and Amy
3. Endangered Species – Melissa and Amy

(and I fit into #2 and 3 with some of my work items as well.)

So, within these three areas, we need to identify our general work priorities. I don't think we want to

get particularly detailed. For CPA and End. Species, don't ID specific project but rather project types or areas of focus. Below I started a few already, but need your input. Everything cannot be a priority. One way to think about this is if you were abducted by aliens in your sleep tonight, what of your responsibilities do you see as most important for the rest of us to carry on in your stead?

EC → Richardson Flats/ Silver Creek;
US Mag;
Jordan River restoration/Sharon Steel fund
Great Salt Lake – perhaps identify a few sub-areas
What else or what different?

CPA → (General criterion for engagement: "Landscape-scale" projects only [e.g., large size, large impact, or large potential for benefit])
Energy projects (renewable energy [wind], transmission lines, pipelines, non-renewables [oil & gas, oil shale & tar sands, coal, mining])
Water development projects
Great Salt Lake 404 (transportation, other development) projects of significant impact
What else or what different?
