Subject: Winter wildlife enforcement at the refuge

Hi Kelly and Liam,

So glad you could both make it to the meeting today. Always a pleasure to see you.


Just FYI -- we are seeing increasingly problematic behaviors at the refuge: photographers harassing owls to get the best photo, trespassing into the dunes, blocking traffic flow, increased illegal parking, etc. All of these behaviors stem from a pair of very photogenic barred owls and coyotes during the season when out staffing is lowest and visitation has increased exponentially. It has become a public safety concern on an active roadway in addition to increasing disturbance to the wildlife we protect. Individually, these behaviors are not overly problematic, but with the masses the impacts are cumulatively significant.

We have taken a number of outreach and enforcement measures to counteract these behaviors, including [this op-ed](#) published in the Newburyport Daily News and banning ALL live parking from the northbound roadway, with mixed success. Our next steps are to issue more violation notices and possibly to limit refuge open hours (e.g., closing 1 hour early, when many of these issues have been occurring).

Might as well send a Pink House update, while I'm at it -- I have been communicating with my in-state colleagues about additional USFWS land purchase options that could be used for a future swap -- notably at Monomoy in Chatham and in the lands around Mashpee. We have also identified at least one parcel in Madbury, NH, with the goal of establishing Great Thicket NWR in that state. So it continues to be a slow process but work is progressing behind the scenes.

Take good care and hope to chat again soon.
