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# Gray Wolf Federal Listing Status

- **2020:** delisting rule
- **2021:** petitions to relist wolves
- **2022:** delisting rule vacated
- **COLORADO**



# Present Status in Colorado

- Federally endangered under ESA
- Take (harass, injure, or kill) of endangered species is prohibited
  - Except in defense of life or the life of others
  - Only non-injurious 'take' allowed
- CPW statutorily required to reintroduce wolves
- Designate wolves as an experimental population in CO to provide increased management flexibility and reduce regulatory burden

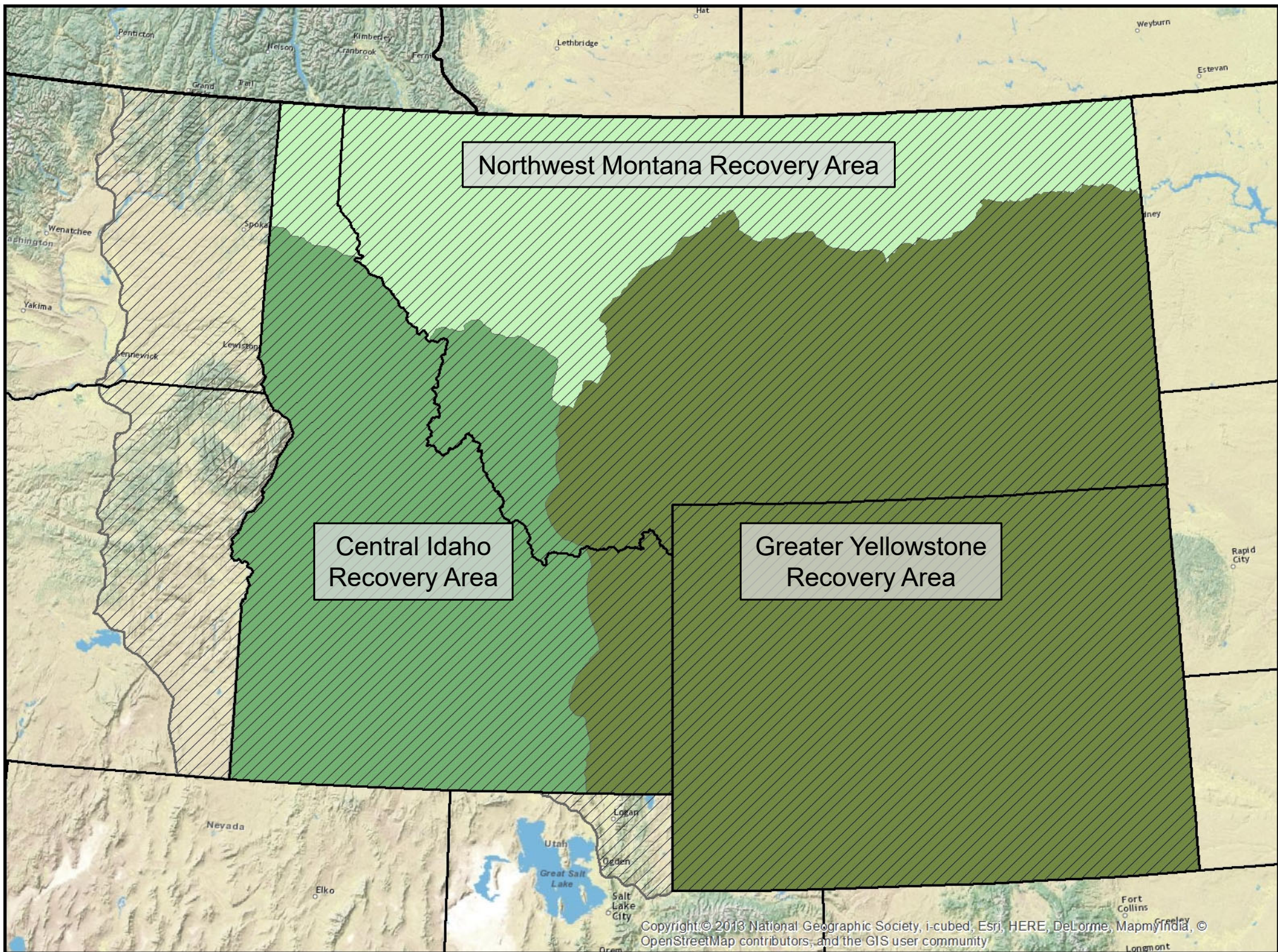
# ESA Section 10(j): Experimental Populations

- Listed species reintroduced outside of current range
- Separated geographically from other populations
  - **POPULATION:** 2 breeding pairs for 2 consecutive years
- All wolves reintroduced in lower 48 states reintroduced as experimental populations

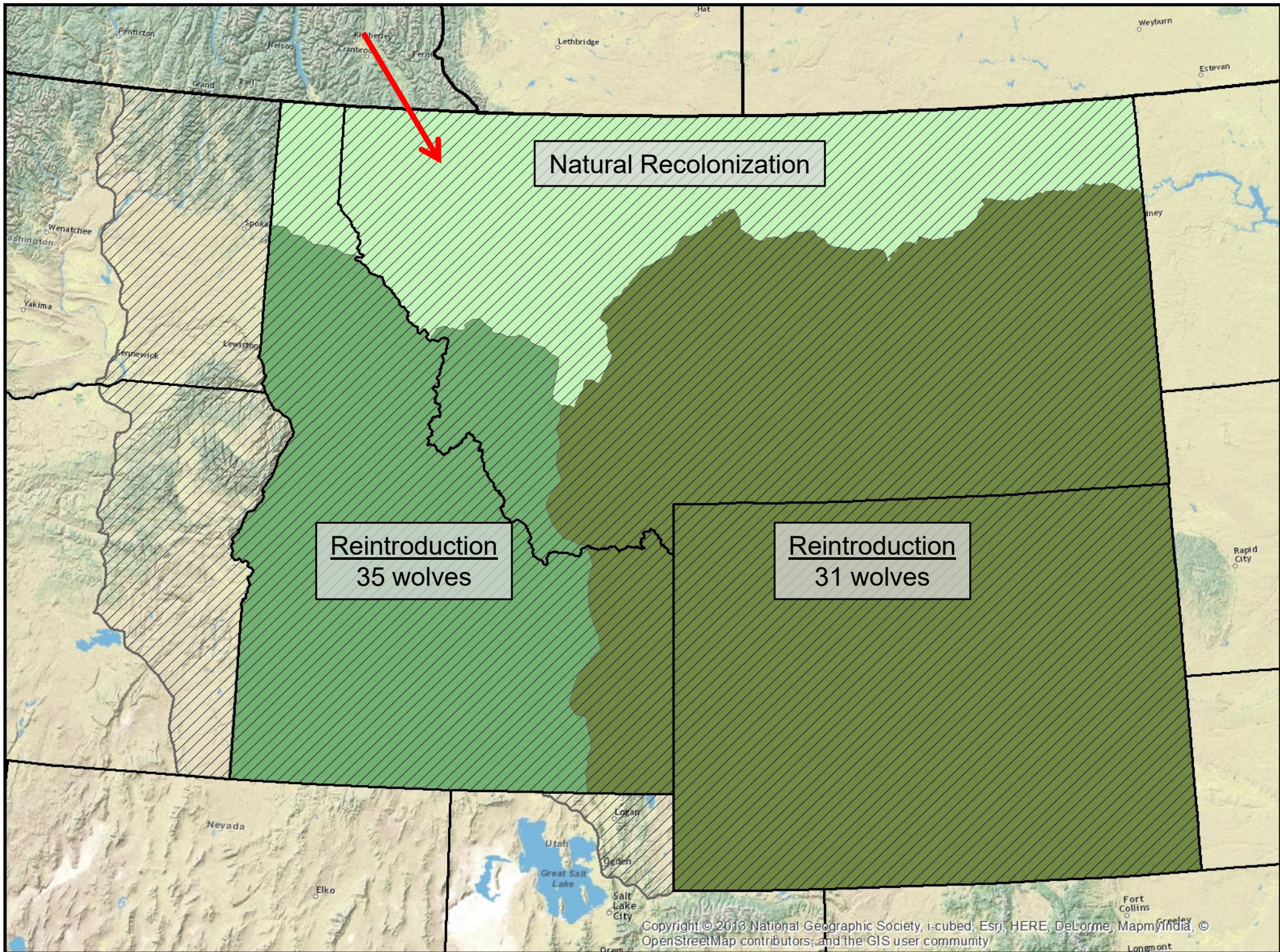
# ESA Section 10(j): Experimental Populations

- Increases flexibility and discretion in managing a reintroduced, listed species
- Less restrictive take prohibitions of listed species
- Clearly defines under what circumstances all forms of take (harass, injure, or kill) may be allowed
- NEPA required and rulemaking process

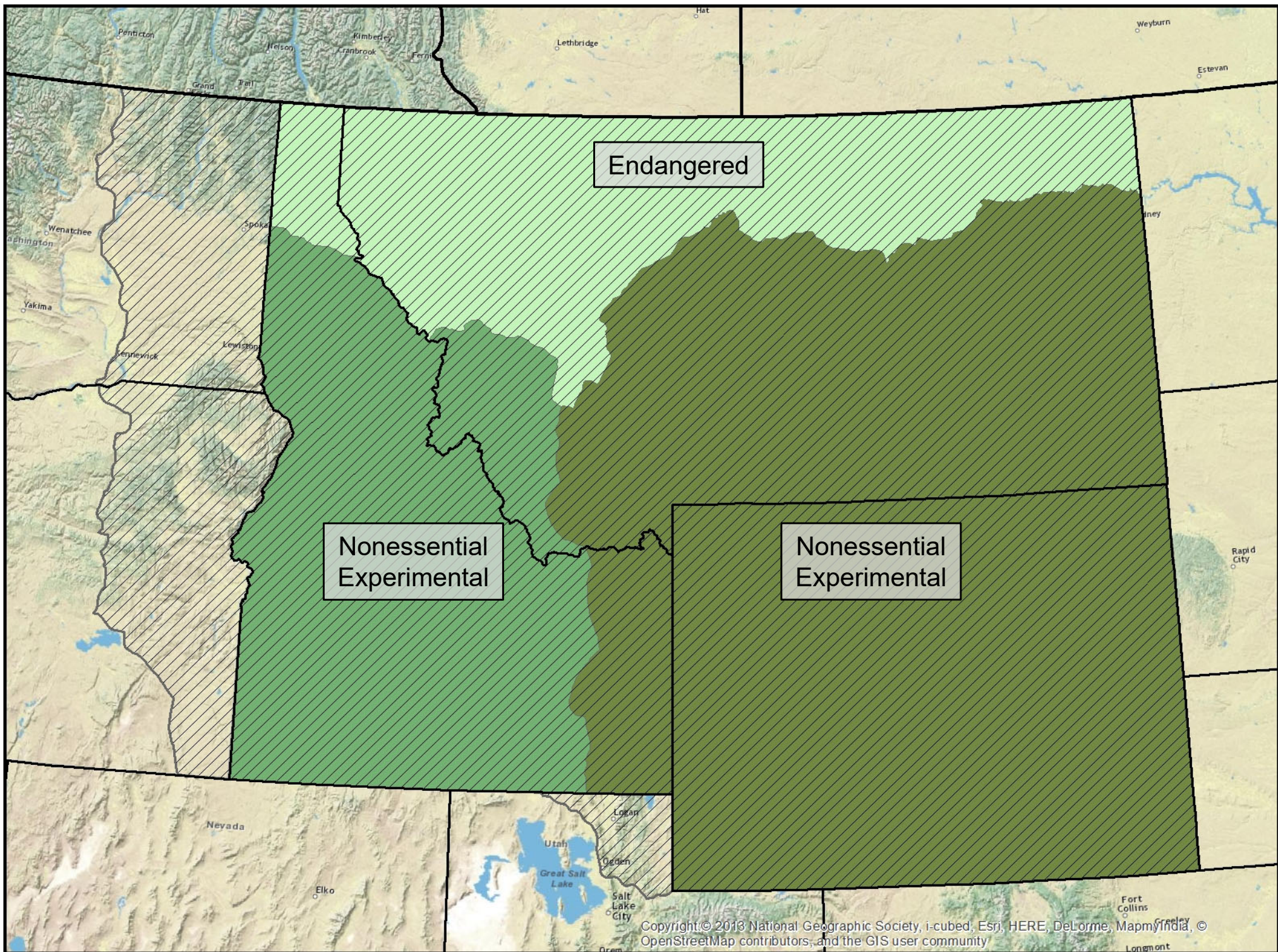

# Project schedule

Timeframe	Milestone
Summer – Fall 2022	Gather data, refine alternatives, analyze impacts, and prepare the Draft EIS
Winter/Spring 2023	Draft EIS and proposed rule available for public review
Fall 2023	Final EIS and rule released; record of decision finalized
December 2023	Final rule becomes effective
