Gerry:

We can follow these guidelines. We will pick up all shell casings that can be safely retrieved. We can also attempt to make a sweep of the island at the end of the hazing to find and pick up any paper projectile cartridges that might survive (biodegradable), unless doing so would present a greater risk to wildlife or personnel.

We will avoid firings any pyrotechnics into the water.

I hope this settles all of the Sanctuary concerns.
