Overall, it's a very good and accurate article. I feel it captures the issues in a way that's easy to understand and interesting to read. I only have a few clarifications:

- 1) Article states that Ashy Storm-Petrels are a candidate for endangered species list. They are not, although they were petitioned for listing. They are listed as a Species of Conservation Concern by the FWS and a Species of Special Concern by California Dept. of Fish and Game (mentioned later in quote from Maggie Sergio).
- 2) Statement of "about 3,000" nesting ashy storm-petrels. Most recent estimate was 1,990 breeders in 1998 and no new estimate has been generated since.
- 3) In the Case Studies section, statement that rats on Anacapa preyed on murrelet and storm-petrel eggs. True for murrelets but not for storm-petrels since the storm-petrels were not (and still aren't) confirmed to breed on the islands.
- 4) In the Any Alternatives section, "diphacinone" misspelled "diphacone".
- 5) "'The ground literally moves,' says McChesney". I've heard it from others but not my quote.

Thank Juliet for doing such a nice job and thanks to the interviewees for providing such good information.
