1. How are the relocation sites determined?
2. Has there been a conflict after relocation with other bears?
3. How often does the bear return to the site where they were captured at?
  - a. Relocation is just one tool in the toolbox bear managers use to help prevent bear conflicts. Other tools such as electric fencing work great for bears that have broken into grain bins, chicken coops, livestock piles etc.
4. Does every grizzly bear get a collar?
  - a. Every grizzly bear that is captured receives a collar. The collar allows bear managers to gather location information, survival/mortality,
5. Do you females with cubs get relocated together?
  - a. This will depend on the situation and location where the conflict occurred. Most female bears with cubs will get relocated together, however, if this is the female 3<sup>rd</sup> conflict the cubs might just be relocated. This will also depend on their age at the time of relocation.
6. Is this bear a threat for public safety?
  - a. A bear that is considered a human threat DOES NOT get relocated
