

APPENDIX 22. PRELIMINARY IDENTIFICATION OF HUMAN-RELATED ATTRACTANT SITES FOR WILDLIFE IN THE BITTERROOT ECOSYSTEM

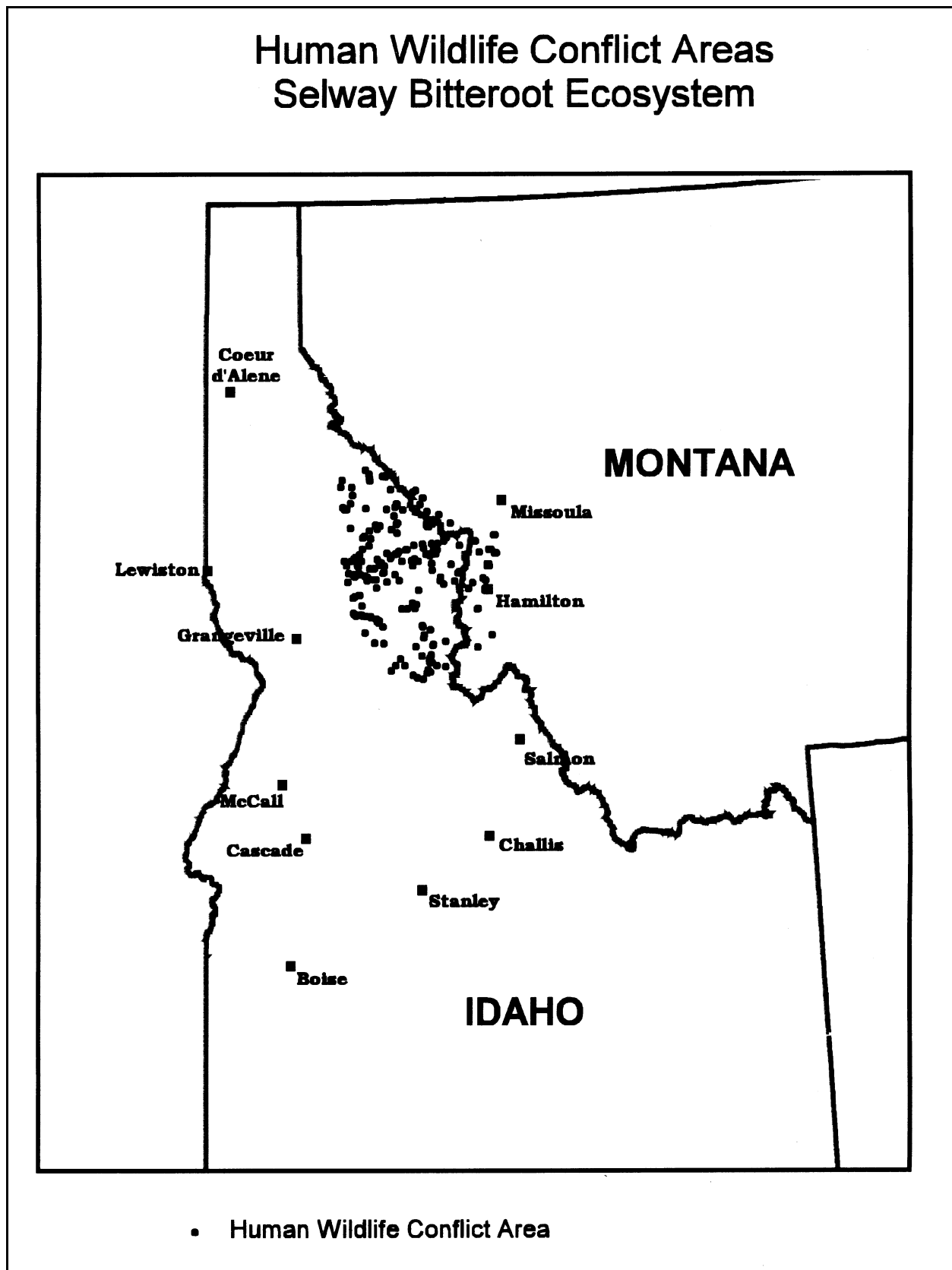


Figure 6-18. Overview of the location of identified sanitation sites in the Bitterroot Ecosystem.

This appendix contains a reprint of the report, “*Survey of Attractant Sites, Selway-Bitterroot Ecosystem*” which was prepared for Defenders of Wildlife, Intermountain Forest Products Association and the National Wildlife Federation. The report was compiled by Brown Bear Resources, Inc. of Missoula, Montana, and was released in December 1998. Figure 6-18 has been adapted from the GIS data mapped with this report, and is included in this appendix to give the reader an overview of the general location of sites identified in the report.

Survey of Attractant Sites: Selway - Bitterroot Ecosystem

December, 1998

Brown Bear Resources conducted a private survey of attractant sites in the Selway- Bitterroot Ecosystem that have resulted in, or have the potential to result in, wildlife-human conflicts. The primary purpose of the survey was to identify area where food and/or garbage are found in close proximity to humans which provide an attractant to wildlife.

The survey covers portions of the Selway-Bitterroot Ecosystem north of the Magruder corridor. It is intended to be a proactive document which will allow managing agencies to remedy problems such as open dumpsters, poorly stored food in campgrounds, etc., in an attempt to reduce human injuries and wildlife loss.

Information was gathered from Montana Fish, Wildlife and Parks; Idaho Department of Fish and Game; Animal Damage Control; Bureau of Land Management; and the U.S. Forest Service. In addition, field inspections were made at several sites to verify information and/or determine the existence of sites.

High priorities determined by project partners include those sites within wilderness areas which contain garbage or readily available foods and stock feed. Simple remedies include food storage poles, wildlife resistant panniers and "food tubes," and general education for wilderness travelers. Additional priorities are for bear resistant dumpsters along Highway 12 and elsewhere as noted on the survey map (GIS map in FEIS Project File in Missoula office).

Funding to address container and education needs will be sought by a coalition of private and public sector agencies. However, it is expected that the project will require several years in order to financially provide for remediation at all sites.

Anecdotal information indicates there is an immediate need to provide orientation and education materials to campground hosts, wilderness guards and recreational hosts who may not at this time be aware of the dangers - both to bears and to humans - associated with food conditioned wildlife. Education programs should also be made a priority for wilderness users on well-traveled routes such as the Selway River, the Lolo Trail and at destination sites such as private lodges.

Final maps are available in a GIS format to allow frequent updates, corrections and evaluation of data by specific categories.

Priority Summary

The groups funding this project determined priorities for remediation based on the immediate need for reduction of human-wildlife conflicts. Consequently, the highest priority was given to sites along Highway 12 and the Lolo Trail was of the Idaho-Montana border. These sites see the highest frequency of visitors and experience problems with bears on a yearly basis. The project partners are working to provide bear-resistant dumpsters for these sites in 1999. Educational materials will also be needed for posting at campgrounds and for campground hosts (where applicable) to distribute. General information to those passing through the area is a much lower priority than for those individuals who camp along the highway or Lolo Trail.

The second series of priorities involves sites along the northern border of the study area west of St. Regis and south to Highway 12. Most of these sites involve state or federal campgrounds (developed and dispersed) as well as outfitter camps. Project partners are developing an instructional program for outfitters, backpackers and other backcountry users based on successful programs in the NCDE and GYE.

Backcountry airstrips, lodges and river camps compose the third set of priorities. These sites are currently “pack-in, pack out” areas. However, it is always tempting for pilots, rafters, canoeists and kayakers to minimize weight in their craft by leaving select items behind. A strong educational effort is planned for these sites, including river launch sites and ranger stations at airstrips. Project partners will work with the USFS on permits for lodges and river users in order to address the attractants frequently found in these areas.

The final priority involves general educational efforts for infrequent, short-term wilderness travelers, lookouts, and neighboring private property owners. The best efforts here would involve a “bear management specialist” similar to those found in the NCDE and GYE. Project partners will work with state and federal agencies to pursue this option.

Over 200 sites were initially identified in the survey. It is important to note that the project did not involve an *inventory* of attractant sites, simply a survey of those that appeared to be the most egregious. As new sites are found and as existing sites are removed from the category of “attractants,” the partners will adjust the map and priorities accordingly. It is envisioned that this project will take several years and significant funding to complete. However, no sites were found that can not be remedied by existing technology and private sector- public agency cooperation.

Definitions: “Remedial Action” refers to programs needed to remove a source of potential wildlife attractants. **“Education”** indicates that a site may benefit from brochures, signage, visits with outfitters, campground hosts, etc. to provide information regarding storage of foods, garbage, stock, feed, etc. **“Container”** indicates a site may need food poles or other such structures. **“Dumpster”** indicates the need for a bear-resistant dumpster.

Site names referred to as “sites” with unknown attractant status are generally historic sites or points of interest along USFS Road #500, the Lochsa Highway or the Lolo Trail. They may draw human visitors; however most have no facilities.
